NEW BUSINESS

1. E-mail Task Force
Consensus was reached that the Senate Council recommends that the Senate Leadership forward the following resolution to the administration with copies to the E-mail Task Force and CCFT.

Because of its commitment to freedom of speech and academic freedom, the Faculty Senate, before deliberating about whether or not to endorse any District policies that result from the work the E-Mail Task Force, would require from the District a written statement, citing code and case law, answering the following questions:

1. Where does the District's jurisdiction over e-mail begin and where does it end? In other words, when is the use of e-mail subject to District policies and when is it not?

The answer to this question should address the use of District computers, the use of the District e-mail system from non-District computers, exchanges among faculty about campus issues from non-District computers, information about off-campus events, and use of District computers for Internet-based activities that are not job related.

2. What types of speech are excluded from legal protection?
3. Are there any campus officials, organizations, or constituencies that are legally exempted, in whole or in part, from District policies on the use of e-mail?
4. What are allowable sanctions for violations of the District's policies regarding the use of e-mail?
