

DATA ELEMENT NAME: Transfers to CSU, UC, Privates, and Cal Poly Admission Rates

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: Transfers from Cuesta college to the CSU and UC systems are tracked and reported by CPEC. Transfers to Private Institutions are tracked via data match with the NSLC. Cal Poly provides Cuesta with Fall Admission data by program of study.

UTILITY OF DATA ELEMENT: Transfer tracking allows the college to monitor its ability to prepare students for transfer.

LIMITATIONS OF DATA ELEMENT: Not all private schools are a part of the NSLC. In other words, if a student transfers from Cuesta to a school that does not belong to the NSLC, Cuesta will not be credited with that transfer. UC transfers by campus only include Fall semesters.

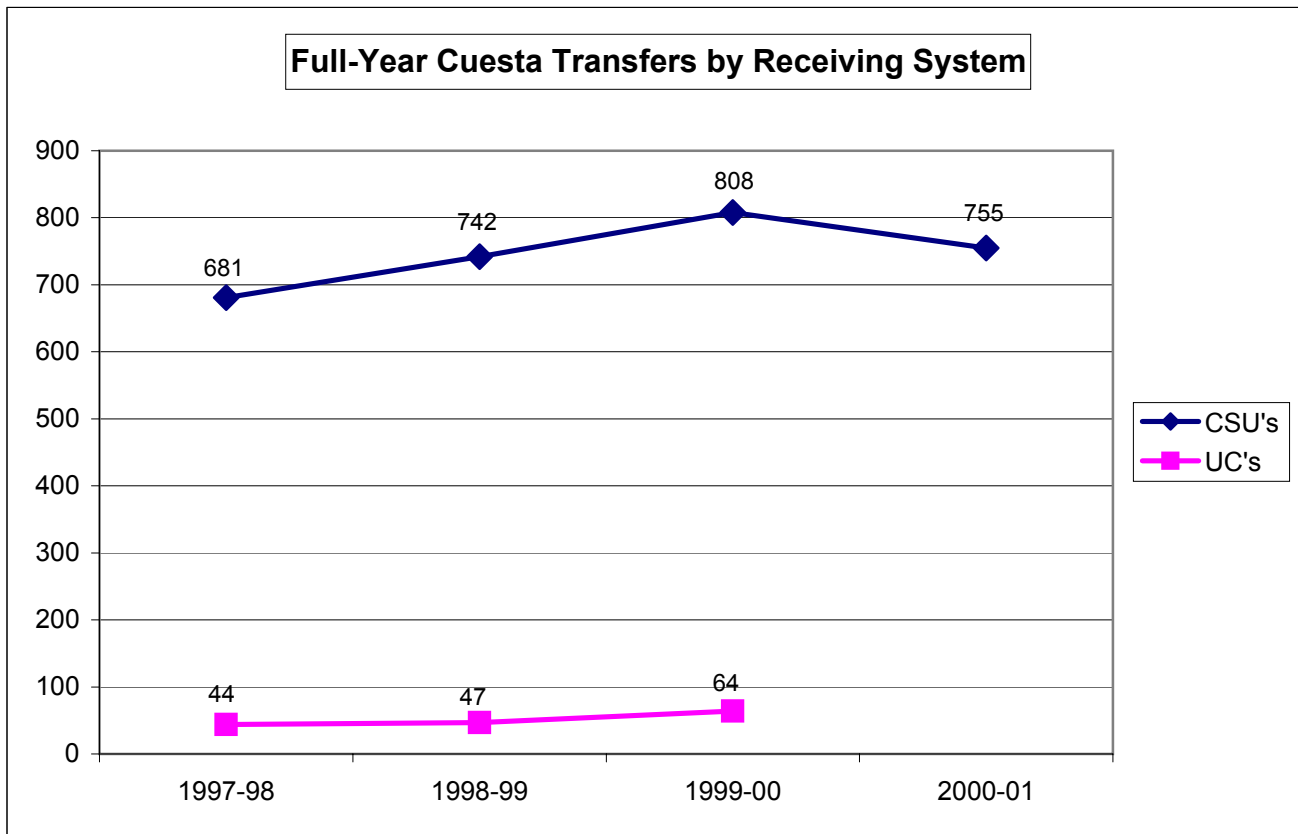
